Planted in 1854, the fruit from the Deaver Ranch in Amador County is one of the oldest vineyards in California and also is one of the last vestiges of the Mission grape in the state. Originally from Spain and brought over to California in the 1700s by the Franciscan missionaries, the Mission grape, which is also known as País, and Listán Prieto in the Canary Islands, was successfully planted in California and used for table, sacramental and fortified wine purposes. Mission is hardy, resistant to drought and prefers the hot and dry climates of the southern United States. *Wild and almost savage like berry aromas spring from the glass along with baking spices and pepper. Crunchy, fresh and delicious on the palate. Super drinkable and enjoyable with any backyard patio cuisine. 50 cases made. \$28 per bottle.*
